#### **STUDY YOUR T-LEVEL WITH US**

We know that deciding what you want to do in the future is an important decision.

There are so many things you'll be thinking about – do I want to go to college or sixth form? Should I do an apprenticeship? Maybe you want a mix of it all.

From September 2024, you will be able to study a range of T-Levels that will help you to get you ready for the workplace whilst learning on campus. Within this booklet you'll find out what T-Levels are and how they're different to A Levels and apprenticeships.

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T-Levels are two-year vocational courses. These qualifications are for students who have just finished GCSEs and want to develop the knowledge and skills that will help them go straight into employment, an apprenticeship or higher education.

With a T-Level, you study one subject with different pathways, in order to gain in-depth knowledge and skills in your chosen area.

T-Levels focus on the practical side of learning. You'll spend 80% of your time in the classroom learning both theory and hands-on skills. The remaining 20% of your time will be spent gaining work experience on a 45-day industry placement with an employer putting those skills into practice.





## WHY STUDY A T-LEVEL

#### CREATED WITH BUSINESSES

More than 250 businesses have helped design T-Levels meaning they give you the skills that employers are really looking for.

#### COMBINE WORK AND STUDY

You'll spend most of your time learning in college, but you'll spent 20% of your time on industry placement with an employer. This will help you to gain real work experience in the industry you want to work in.

#### UCAS POINTS

T-Levels are worth UCAS points and a T-Level Distinction is worth the same as three A levels at A\*.

#### PROGRESSION OPPORTUNITIES

Whether you want to go into higher education, an apprenticeship or straight into work, a T-Level will give you a nationally recognised qualification to help you do just that.


